Rev. Les Coomer and C. J. Beckett were united in marriage here at the church on July 13th. May God bless them as they serve Him in their new life together.




Children's Choir

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR: EVERYDAY FAITH

We are in the midst of doing a series of sermons on Faith based on Hebrews chapter 11. In some quick snippets from the Old Testament we can see where faith played into the lives of people in the book of Genesis as well as in our lives today. Faith may seem to some as only foolish, wishful thinking. But the amount of faith or even more importantly the use of faith in their lives or lack of faith made a huge difference in how things turned out or turn out now. Adam and Eve tested the faith they had in God and things changed drastically and they lost. Noah had enough faith to build an ark in the desert when it was dry not a cloud in the sky. He was called foolish, senile, crazy and every other name people could think of. But, God had told him to do it and in spite of what others said or thought he worked on day after day until the ark was completed. The problem was, it didn't rain. Not for a while. But when it did, Noah and his family were prepared. They had been told when to board ship. They did so. Sprinkles turned into torrents of rain. The boat began to rise with floods and drift with the wind and current. The naysayers, skeptics, mockers were trying (too late) to get on board. But there was no entrance available then. Noah and his family were saved by faith.

The chapter will show the tremendous faith of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. When faith was the guide, they succeeded. When their faith failed, they failed. The Bible is full of stories of faith and those who obeyed in both Old and New Testaments.

We are called to be people of faith. That means we are ready to trust God no matter what. Is that easy to do? Absolutely not! When the cards are stacked against us, it is difficult to trust. But we are called to live a life of faith and faithfulness.

Read the Book and the stories. You can also read stories much more recent of people who lived by faith – not seeing the end of the tunnel, but knowing there is an end to that tunnel. Let's exercise faith in the small things so we can be guided by and live by faith in life's hardest challenges. (Joe)




Our Kids
