Pastor's Corner:

In just a few weeks, we will observe Valentine's Day. For some, this "Hallmark day" will be celebrated by buying flowers, chocolate candy, or a special card for someone we love. For others, it is a day that holds little significance or importance. Regardless of how you choose to celebrate Valentine's Day, it holds the potential of being a day that can remind us of the people in our lives that are important to us and the love that we share together. Thinking about Valentine's Day led me to ponder how we express our love for God. Just within the last couple of days, I have been surrounded by experiences that have reminded me of just a few of the different ways that God's love is expressed.

CORPORATE: I had the wonderful privilege of attending the Resurrection youth conference with the Allen Memorial youth group this past weekend in Gatlinburg. As I watched them express their love for God through singing songs in worship and responding to the preacher for the weekend, I was struck by their authenticity and genuine encounter with God. Within the blaring music, the strobe lights, and the fog machine, we were reminded of God's extravagant love offered to each of us.

<u>COMMUNITY</u>: I was asked to participate with other pastors in a community-wide worship celebration on Martin Luther King Day. It was an absolutely amazing experience to be within a diverse community of people who were celebrating God's love that knows no boundaries of race or nationality. As we shared a fellowship meal after the worship service, it was a wonderful reminder of the beautiful diversity that exists within God's Kingdom.

INDIVIDUAL: As I was driving down the interstate last week, I was listening to some worship music that I was familiar with. After a few minutes, I found myself completely overwhelmed with being reminded of God's love and presence in my life. This experience reminded me that God comes to each of us on an individual level to fill us with God's love and remind us of God's continued presence in our lives. We just have to slow down enough to hear God's continual call upon our lives.

Over the next few weeks you will have the opportunity to celebrate all of these expressions of God's love at Allen Memorial UMC. As we join in **corporate worship** each Sunday morning, we are reminded of God's enduring love and forgiveness. As we come together as a church **community** to participate in the Souper Bowl challenge, we have the opportunity to provide food to our neighbors that are in need. And as we come together as a community of faith on Ash Wednesday, we will be challenged to consider how we will **individually** commit ourselves to seek a deeper walk with God during Lent. **I encourage you to get connected to the life of Allen Memorial UMC and experience the many ways that God's love is expressed.**
