Pastor's Corner:

Sometimes it is funny to stop and pay attention to the things that we focus on. For the past few weeks, I have been focused on packing my condo in Cleveland and getting moved to Athens. (It's a wonder the things you find when you move!) The last few days here in Athens, we have been focused

on the brutal snow storm that hit our area. I'm not sure if the parents were excited about the snow festivities but it certainly seemed like the kids and "young at heart" really enjoyed it. As important as a focus like moving and snow can be, there is a greater focus that we are called to as Christians and as the church of Allen Memorial UMC. That centers around our focus of Lent.

I grew up in a church tradition that did not celebrate Lent but I have come to find that it is one of the most special times of the Church year for me. Lent is a period of forty days leading up to Easter. It is a time that allows us to take a serious look at our relationship with God and how we can grow as a Christian disciple. One of the ways that some people celebrate Lent is to sacrifice a luxury that they are accustomed to, like chocolate, coffee, or TV. I have done this in the past but I have taken a little bit of a different approach the last couple of years. Instead of giving up something for Lent, I have been adding something to my spiritual journey of Lent. This has ranged from a specific time of prayer to a particular Bible study during these days. I have found that adding something to my Lenten journey has made this a much richer experience.

So before you get focused on how you will celebrate Easter or what you will do during Spring Break that is coming just around the corner, I encourage you to focus your attention on the celebration of Lent. Take some time to think about how this time can be used to deepen your walk with God. Be sure to check out the article in this newsletter that gives you some options on how we as a church will be celebrating Lent. I'm glad to be here with you at Allen Memorial during these days!
