Hands-On Mission Project— Health Kits --Zimbabwe The Cleveland District Goal is 300 kits. Pack the following items in a 2-gallon Zip-Loc bag: 1 washcloth, 2 bars soap, 2 toothbrushes, 2 tubes toothpaste (6.5 oz. or less), 1 bottle adult Listerine OR Listerine Smart Rinse for children (250 ml or less), 1 box kids' chewable Tyleno/acetaminophen (30 ct.), 1 bottle Tylenol/acetaminophen 500 mg (24 ct.), 1 bottle Advil/ibuprofen (24 ct.) 1 bottle Delsym 12-hour cough syrup for children and adults (3 oz. or less), Benadryl—1 bottle children's liquid (4 oz. or less) OR 1 box adult tabs (24 ct.). A \$5.00 donation for shipping should accompany each kit. DO NOT put the money inside the bag. The bags are available on the table in the side vestibule. Return your completed kit to the side vestibule. All kits must be returned by June 1.
