Holston Conference Report By: Becky Jaquish

Thank you for allowing me to represent Allen Memorial at Holston Annual Conference. Lake Junaluska is a beautiful, peaceful place to worship and to conduct the business of Holston.

There was no controversy regarding the reports presented to the delegates, and even the 2014 budget

passed with no questions asked! The Finance committee had worked diligently and prayerfully to be good stewards of our gifts.

The report of each District's collection of kits (health, school, etc.) was read and the total dollar value was over \$250,000! Many Districts exceeded their goal for number of kits, some giving twice the number. Cleveland District barely met the goal. Hopefully we can remedy that next year!

There were two Conference highlights for me. The first was the announcement on Monday evening that Holston Conference raised \$1,133,250 for Imagine No Malaria, exceeding our goal! The response in the auditorium was like a winning touchdown in Neyland Stadium. Together we saved more than 113,000 lives, and at the candlelight service of celebration we were told that the candle each of us held represented 151 lives!

The second highlight was being present to experience the Ordination of our own Jake Herron. His radiant smile as he received the designation of Elder reflected his love of our Lord and his eager anticipation for the ministry ahead.

The main point of the speaker's messages was that as Christians we are not called to sit, to stand or to stay. We are called to "GO!"

The weather was perfect (after Sunday night!), the lake beautiful, the music wonderful and the messages uplifting and challenging. Altogether this Conference was Holston at its best!

The **Holston Conference** met at Lake Junaluska in North Carolina June 9-12.

Attending were Becky Jaquish as our church lay member and Abby Bryant representing the Conference youth. Abby helped serve communion several times. She did a great job.

The clergy and lay members met separately on Sunday afternoon for their annual sessions. Sunday night was the opening worship service with Holy Communion. Monday through Wednesday were business sessions with worship and communion in the evenings.

The Imagine No Malaria had a goal of \$1 million to save 100,000 lives. Our church has been generous in saving so far 313 lives. As serving on the Task Force for INM we were not confident that goal would be reached by Annual Conference so we agreed to continue the project though the rest of the year. It was announced at Annual Conference that the total received to date was \$!,135,250 or 113,525 lives. Praise to God for what has been done. We are still going to continue the project through the end of the year so you still have time to give if you haven't or to give more. We want to see Malaria eradicated in Africa as it has been in America.

On Wednesday morning of Annual Conference the Ordination service was held. Jake Heron was ordained as an elder. The last portion of Annual Conference is always the setting of the appointments for the new year. I am glad to say that I was appointed to serve at Allen Memorial for another year.
