For the past year, I've been a part of a Cleveland District committee that has been looking at how we can rethink how we do church and how to reach people who do not know God. As a ReThink team, we have read several books. looked at tons of research.

and dedicated ourselves to intentional prayer about what our next steps would be. A few months ago, this team decided to focus on five specific areas of our District and work with those churches and pastors to strengthen the ministry of the church in those areas. We also decided to work with some of the churches that were represented by our team members.

I tell you all of this to let you know that Allen Memorial has been asked to participate in this ReThink process in the Cleveland District. We were asked to choose 8 church members that would make up the AMUMC team and we have begun the work that has been set before us. We will be participating in a ReThink training in October that will help us look at who we are as a church and how we can be in ministry to our community. We are already reading material that is challenging us to look at how our church can become an even greater witness for Christ in our community. Please understand that this committee does not have the power to make any changes in what we are already doing or will do in the future; our task is to vision and dream about how we can do even greater ministry and outreach to our community.

I'm excited about the work that we will be doing in the Cleveland District and here at Allen Memorial. We will truly be seeking how the needs of our community and our world intersect with the love of God. This is a great challenge but one that has to be met so more people can come to know of God's love. I ask you to be in prayer for this work in the district but also the team from Allen Memorial. The front end of this process is heavy and we are already feeling overwhelmed by the amount of things that we are asked to do as a part of this process but we are committed to doing this work so that we can be better prepared for what lies ahead.

George smiled as the milkman brought in ten large cans of milk. It was just enough for 300 thirsty children.
