Pastor's Corner

You may be aware that I am sending out a "One Call" message to the congregation each Wednesday. I do this message simply as a way to remind you in the middle of the week of God's continued love and presence in each of our lives regardless

of the circumstances that we are presented with.

I believe in the power of prayer and most certainly have seen times in which God works in ways that are beyond our comprehension and understanding. We all need to be reminded that God is still working in each of our lives and prayer is a way that we can be brought closer into knowing God's presence and peace for our lives. Prayer is much more than offering God a list of our needs or desiring that God would work in a certain way. Interceding in prayer for others and for our world is both a privilege and a responsibility that we must take very seriously. It is a way that we grow in relationship with God and with one another.

One of the ways in which John Wesley approached discipleship and prayer is offered in what he calls the "Wesleyan Covenant prayer." This was a prayer that he used as a part of worship to renew the covenant with God. I offer these words to you as a way that we can continue to grow in our relationship with God:

> "I am no longer my own, but yours. Put me to what you will, rank me with whom you will; put me to doing; put me to suffering; let me be employed for you, or laid aside for you, exalted for you, or brought low for you; let me be full; let me be empty; let me have all things; let me have nothing.

> I freely and wholeheartedly yield all things to your pleasure and disposal. And now, glorious and blessed God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, you are mine and I am yours. So be it. And the covenant now made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven.

His labors were an action of kindness, love and thanksgiving for her attitude and endurance.

Yes, God is good and His love is shared in so many ways. Here people gathered in love, forgetting for a moment what the future holds, knowing God came to be with them in an unusual way and will still be in days to come.

Don't forget to give thanks not only in November but every day. God is always generous with His mercy and grace. Remember your sheep!

You can help by picking up a wrapped/empty shoe box and filling it with small useful or fun items.


Return filled shoe boxes to the pew in the side vestibule. Don't forget to include the shipping fee of \$7.00.
